A Brief History of

Government Islamia Graduate College Civil Lines, Lahore

racing the history of Islamia Graduate College, Civil Lines involves presenting illustrious educational chronicles of two highly influential educational movements of their times.

The Anjuman Hamayat- e- Islam, under its first president, Qazi Muhammad Hamid-ud-Din established few schools (Madaaris) famously known as Madrassat-ul-Muslimeen with the aim to provide education to Muslim children. In October 1886, a primary school on the same analogy was established having capacity of only 30 students which kept on shifting from one place to the other including Tavela Shah Nawaz,

Haveli Sikandar Khan, Haveli Dhayan Singh and eventually found its way to Sheranwala Gate. The school was upgraded to Middle in 1888, Secondary in 1889 and College (intermediate level) in 1892. In 1896 Islamia College was affiliated with the Punjab University, Lahore and the first graduate program was offered matching the turn of the century. It was at that time the only arts college in Punjab affiliated with the Punjab University, Lahore. In 1906, the Anjuman with the contributions of local Muslim philanthropists and funds raised by the Islamia College students procured 50 kanal land between Brandreth and Railway Road, Lahore for the establishment of College Campus and hostel and the dream came true in 1914 in shape of a graceful block of buildings known today as Govt. Islamia Graduate College, Railway Road, Lahore.

Allama Muhammad Iqbal and many other Muslim leaders expressed their desire that this college is shifted to some spacious site.



In 1947, just after the partition, when almost all the local population of Hindus migrated to India, and massive Muslim migration brought hundreds of thousands of distressed people to Lahore. During those times of great trial, the building of DAV College housed hundreds of homeless Muslim immigrants from all over India.

DAV

(Dayanand Anglo Vedic College):

Arya Samaj movement which established DAV (Dayanand Anglo Vedic) School in the present building on June 1st, 1886. The school was named after the founder of Arya Samaj Movement, the prominent Hindu social worker Dayanand Sarasvati. Many prominent Lahore philanthropists of the late 19th century generously contributed towards the construction of the grand building of the school. Every building contains list of people who contributed in the construction of that specific block. Sir Ganga Ram and Bhai Ram Singh conceived its architecture design as per

academic needs and reflecting pure Indian, Gothic & Mughal's style.

In just two years DAV School was upgraded. Intermediate classes started in 1888 and the name was changed to DAV

College. In 1892 the college offered its first Bachelors program and in the next three years, in 1895 the MA program was also offered. Major subjects taught at that time were English Literature, Sansikrit, Persian, History, Philosophy,



Mathematics, Physics and Chemistry.

When the migrants were rehabilitated elsewhere, in half of the building, Licentiate State Medical School faculty (LSMF)-- School was established. The other half of the DAV College building was handed over to 'Taleem ul Islam College' which was later moved to Rabwa in 1954.

A Dream That Came True:

A dream of Allama Iqbal and other Muslim leaders came true when the Anjuman- e- Himayat e Islam, the largest charity and welfare organization of its times, acquired a part of the campus for establishment of Islamia College, Lahore offering to renovate it. The Anjuman shifted its BA and MA classes to this campus under the name, Islamia College. When Licentiate State Medical Faculty School (LSMF) School was moved to Bahawalpur in 1955, the complete block and building were handed over to Anjuman- e- Himayat Islam. So, during the period 1954 to 1958, intermediate classes were held at Islamia College, Railway Road, Lahore. However, BA and MA classes were held at Islamia


College, Civil Lines. Both campuses were administered by the same Principal.

Independent Status:

In 1958, the Anjuman decided to grant independent status to the Civil Lines Campus of Islamia College and renowned scholar Prof. Hameed Ahmad Khan was appointed its first Principal on 01st May 1958. It was decided that intermediate classes would continue at Islamia College Railway Road campus and Degree/ Postgraduate classes commence at the newly established Islamia College Civil Lines Lahore; the intermediate classes were subsequently started at Islamia College Civil Lines Lahore in 1965 and achieved the status of imparting education from intermediate to postgraduate level. Beside equipping the youth with high quality education, the college also explored new avenues of co-curricular activities. Consequently, the college remained a rich source of talented sportsmen in all major sports like hockey, cricket, boxing, athletics and football.

The college is presently going through its important phase that started over 50 years ago as a result of the policy of nationalization in 1972, when all private educational institutions were nationalized. Consequently, Islamia College became Government Islamia College, Civil Lines and has been run, since then, by the Ministry of Education, the Government of the Punjab.

These 50 years witnessed further growth both in the






number of students and on campus buildings to house those large numbers of students. On 7th May 1990 a new Science Block was built to accommodate growing number of science students. On April 22, 1996 another one the Computer Block was established. Since the hostel lodging facility was under enormous pressure, a three story new block of students' hostel residences was built in 1998. Being a college of exhibiting of high academic performance, Govt. Islamia College, Civil Lines has always been under tremendous pressure to accommodate maximum number of students in various courses. To meet the growing need for rooms, the government established a PostGraduate Block in 2007. Now, another spacious academic block was completed and made functional for academic activities. In 2021, Govt. of the Punjab, Higher Education Department categorized colleges all over the Punjab in terms of the programs/ degrees and this College was designated as Govt. Islamia Graduate College, Civil Lines, Lahore.

This is indeed a very brief introduction to a place blossoming with history and tradition. The human effort that went a long way to contribute to the betterment of this alma mater of distinction deserves a much larger mention and appreciation. The rooms, halls and corridors of this magnificent campus have seen probably hundreds of tireless teachers becoming role models for fresh and highly receptive youthful minds.

The sons of the college are serving as educationists, researchers, engineers, doctors, public servants, politicians, artists men in rank and plumes, with many a distinction. In law and politics, Rana Muhammad Iqbal, Mian Manzoor Ahmad Watoo, Bilal Yasin,








and Malik Muhammad Munsaf Awan, Mian Aslam Igbal and in journalism and art Dr. Faqir Hussain Saga, Muhammad Hassan Askri, C.M. Munir, Mamoon Aiman, Hafeez Tahir and Adeel Burki and poets and men of letters Brig. (R) Sadique Salik, Dr. Waheed Qureshi, Amjad Islam Amjad, Dr. Gohar Naushahi, Dr. Tehseen Feragi and Altaf Oureshi and in teaching Prof. Airak Siprin, Prof Shuhrat Bukhari, Dr. Sajjad Baqar Rizvi and Dr. Zulfiqar Ali Malik and many others alumnies have proved their worth in their respective fields. The college also provides facilities to students participate in sports. Our trained players have always brought a good name and repute to the college and country in international Olympics and Asian games. SEMESTER RULES

BS 4 YEARS PROGRAMMES

Since: 1958

TOTAL PERIOD OF STUDY

The normal duration of a 4-year bachelor (BS) program is four years. Each academic year consists of two semesters.

SCHEDULE OF SEMESTERS

Each semester will be of 17 working weeks - 16 weeks for teaching and one week for Mid Semester Examinations. Final Examinations will be conducted by University of the Punjab at the end of each semester. Schedule (date sheet) of final examinations will be issued by Controller of Examinations, University of the Punjab.

CREDITS REQUIREMENTS FOR A DEGREE PROGRAMME

- A minimum 124 -136 credit hours (see 4 below for definition) are required for the 4 years degree programs. The said credits will normally be earned in eight semesters.
- A course may range from one credit hour to four credit hours.
- One credit hour stands for at least one hour class contact per week per semester. For practical/laboratory work 3 hours

will be considered equivalent to one credit hour.

• Six (06) credit hours research project (dissertation) / project report / internship / special paper will be offered in the fourth year/7th semester.

CLASS ATTENDANCE

- A student must have attended at least 75% of the classes held in a course in order to be allowed to sit in the final examination.
- In case the student remains absent from the class for seven consecutive days without leave his name will be stuck off from the college rolls.

COURSE EVALUATION, COURSE GRADE, AND GRADE DISTRIBUTION

Students will be evaluated on the basis of two examinations, called Mid Semester Examination and Final Examination, homework, quizzes, assignments, presentations, etc. These evaluation instruments and their percentage weight of a grade are given below:

Evaluation Instrument

Percentage Weight

- 1. Sessional (Quizzes, assignments, presentations, etc) 15%
- 2. Mid Semester Examination 25%
- 3. Final Examination 60%



EVALUATION SYSTEM

- 1. The course teacher is responsible for the evaluation of work/performance of the students of his class and for the award of grades to them on the basis of such evaluation.
- The number and nature of tests and assignments depends on the nature of course. To pass a course, a student must obtain 50% marks (i.e., 'D' grade) cumulative in Mid Semester Examination, Sessional Work, and Final Examination.
- There will be no choice in questions in the mid semester and final examination papers.
- The scripts of each activity, i.e., Mid Semester Examination, homework, quiz etc. will be shown to the students concerned by the teachers within one week, taken back immediately in accordance with the announced schedule along with the examination schedule.
- In case a student is not satisfied with his award even after checking his answer book, or clarification from the teacher, he may make written complaint to Principal/Coordinator within two weeks of the end of Mid Semester Examinations. The Principal/Coordinator will refer his case to the Examination Committee of the Department/College.

The Mid Semester Examinations will be conducted only one time after eight weeks of the commencement of the semester. The final examination will be conducted according to the schedule (i.e., date sheet) announced by University of the Punjab.

- The duration of the examinations will be as follows:
 - a. Mid Semester Examination:

 One hour
 - b. Final Semester Examination:
- Three hours
- c. Practical Examination (where applicable): 2-3 hours
- Examinations will be held on consecutive days excluding holidays. Examinations for theory and practical (i.e., lab) of a course will be held on the same day. The schedule (i.e., date sheet) of the Mid Semester Examinations will be displayed on the notice board by the college administration well in time.
- Home assignments will be submitted to the teacher concerned as scheduled by the concerned teacher.

GRADING SYSTEM

- 1. Letter grading should only be used for representing the individual courses and not for semester GPA or CGPA.
- 2. Equivalence in numerical grades, letter grades and grade points will be as follows:

- 1. Maximum possible Grade Point Average is 4.00.
- 2. Minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average for obtaining a 4-year BS degree is 2.00.
- 3. A fraction of mark in a course is to be counted as '1' mark e.g. 64.1 or 64.9 is to be shown as 65.
- 4. Letter Grade and Grade Point for a course will be calculated according to the above table.

- **5.** Calculation of Grade Point Average (GPA) for a Semester.

In order to calculate the GPA, multiply Grade Point with the Credit Hours in each Course to obtain total grade points, add up to cumulative Grade Points and divide by the total number of Credit Hours to get the GPA for the Semester.

Course with 'F' grade will be counted as 'Zero' Grade Point for calculation of semester Grade Point Average. Calculation of cumulative grade point average will only be made when a candidate has passed all the courses required for the award of degree.

1.Only the course number, course title, course credit hours, percentage marks in a course, course grade, semester GPAs, overall percentage marks in the degree, and CGPA will be reported on the transcripts.

PROMOTION RULES

- 1. A student must obtain a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) of 2.00 at the end of each semester for promotion to the next semester.
- 2. In case a student is able to obtain GPA of 1.70 or more but less than 2.00 except first semester where GPA of 1.50 or more but less than 2.0, he will be promoted to the next Semester on probation (1st probation). If the student does not achieve the desired CGPA of 2.0 but obtain CGPA greater than or equal to 1.7, will go to 2nd (last) probation. The candidate, who fails to secure 1.50 GPA in the first semester or 1.70 CGPA in a subsequent semester, will stand automatically dropped from the rolls of the college.
- 3. A student will have the right to avail probation twice in the following semesters.
- 4. A student has to obtain CGPA 2.00 in the last semester of each program for the award of the degree.

- 5. In the first, third and fifth, seventh, (where applicable) semesters a student will be required to repeat those courses of the 1st, 3rd, 5th and 7th semesters, respectively, in which he had failed.
- 6. In the 2nd, 4th, 6th, 8th (where applicable) semester, a student will be required to repeat those courses of the second, fourth, sixth and eighth semesters, respectively, in which he had failed.
- 7. If a student gets D grade, he can repeat the course when offered to improve his grade.
- 8. A student, who completes all the courses and has not been required to repeat any course(s), obtains CGPA less than 2.00 but not less than 1.90 at the end of the 8th semester may be allowed to repeat 12 credit hour courses in which he had obtained the lowest grades, in order to improve the CGPA so as to obtain the minimum of 2.00 CGPA failing which he shall not be awarded degree and removed from the rolls of the College.
- 9. In case a student repeats the course(s) for the improvement of graders) which he already taken; he has to pay extra fee of Punjab university the out of the two grades of the course(s) will be counted for CGPA calculations.

PROBATION

The promotion of a student on probation will be allowed twice in the whole degree programs. If a student in the first semester obtains CGPA less than 2.0 and greater than or equal to 1.5, he/she will be considered on probation.

In the subsequent semesters (i.e., second semester onwards), the student will be considered on probation if he scores CGPA less than 2.0, and greater than or equal to 1.70. In case student does not achieve the minimum desired CGPA of 2.0 in any semester after availing two probations, he will be dropped from the rolls of the College and can get admission in the 1st semester in the same College.

CALCULATION OF FINAL RESULT

1. Minimum requirements for the award of a degree

- I. A candidate must have qualified in accordance with the existing Rules and Regulations in each one of the semesters from 1-8 separately, i.e. by securing at least a 'D' in the course(s) as to fulfill the requirements laid down in (ii & iii) below:
- ii. He must have earned the prescribed credits hours required for the degree, i.e., 124 136 credits, as the case may be for a particular degree.
- iii. He must have obtained a minimum Cumulative Grade Point Average of 2.00.

2. Method for Calculation of the Final CGPA

Add up Cumulative Grade Points of all Semesters to obtain grand total and then divide the grand total by total number of credits of the courses studied. The resulting figure will represent the Cumulative Grade Point average secured by a candidate. The CGPA will be reported up to two decimals but for the determination of merit position, CGPA will be calculated up to any decimal.



COURSE WORKLOAD AND CHANGE OF COURSE

- 1. A student who had earned an 'F' grade in a course in 1st semester may be allowed to take one additional course during the 3rd semester.
- 2. A student who had earned an 'F' grade in a course in the 2nd, 3rd, 4th, 5th or 6th semester may be allowed to take one additional course in next semester.
- 3. The student who had earned an "F" grade in a course in 7th and 8th semester can can appear in the exams of coming semesters enroll again in 7th and 8th semester of next class (i.e., the following year).
- 4. The students who have earned 'F' grade in any course or have earned 'D' grade in any course and want to improve grade.

RE-TAKE EXAMINATION

If a student fails in a course, he will be provided two chances to pass a course by registering for the course again in the same semester of the subsequent years. If a student fails to pass the course after availing these two chances, he will be dropped from the rolls of the college.

FREEZING OF A SEMESTER

In case of a valid reason a student may freeze his studies maximum for one year (two semesters) subject to the permission of Principal/ Coordinator of the Department/College along with the university.



EXTRACT FROM ADMISSION POLICY & INSTRUCTIONS FOR INTERMEDIATE CANDIDATES

- 1. Admission will be granted strictly on merit.
- 2. First preference would be given to the fresh candidates for admission. Candidates appearing in Supplementary examination (Session 2023) are allowed to get admission on merit only subject to the availability of seats.
- 3. The name of candidate, father's name and date of birth on the admission form must be strictly according to the matriculation certificate.
- 4. Copy of CNIC/B-Form must be provided at the time of admission.
- |5. Only a photocopy of the original matric result card will be accepted | with the admission form while the web generated print will be rejected.
- 6. Photo bearing white background should be attached with the application form.
- 7. The candidates applying for admission on the basis of Hifiz-e-Quran will submit a certificate from a registered Madrassah, recognized by Wafaq-ul-Madaris from where he has completed his Hifiz-e-Quran and he has to pass the oral test before admission.
- 8. "Disability Certificate" obtained from the District Disability Board must be attached with the admission form for "Disable Quota Seats". The candidates applying for admission on "Disable Quota Seats" must write (Special Candidate) in bold letters on the admission form.

- 9. Final assessment of students possessing 'O' level degrees will be made keeping in view the percentage of their marks in 'O' level. The 'O' level candidate should provide original equivalent certificate issued by IBCC, at the time of interview.
- 10. Candidates are required to Opt for their subject combination carefully as it will not be changeable, once finalized, according to rules/policy.
- 11. Double registration in BISE is not allowed, nor it is possible. If a candidate has applied for admission in more than one college, he is directed to finalize his priority well in time and withdraw his application from the college where he is not interested to get admission to avoid any discrepancy.
- 12. After submission of admission form the candidates will also be required to upload the same particulars on the website: **www.ocas.punjab.gov.pk** so that their names would be included in the merit list of the college.
- 13. Candidate would apply for each category separately. After submission of admission forms, no category /discipline/group would be changed.
- 14. Only eligible candidates will be called for interview on dates mentioned in the list of the candidates eligible for admission.
- 15. After completion of all formalities pertaining to admission, the merit list would be displayed on College Notice Board.
- 16. The candidates who fail to deposit their dues within due dates will lose their right to admission.
- 17. Applications of students of Second Shift for change of their admission to First Shift shall not be entertained at any cost.





18. Students of Second Shift are not allowed to take classes in the First Shift programme. In case of violation strict disciplinary action shall be proceeded against them.

19. The candidate applying for admission who have passed SSC examination other than Lahore Board must provide original N.O.C. from the concerned Board at the time of submission of Admission Forms otherwise their admission forms shall not be entertained.

20. The students seeking admission in second shift will have to submit a separate admission form.

Note: College Admission Committee has the right to cancel the admission of a candidate at any stage, after the admission, when it comes to their knowledge that the documents presented by him are fake or there is a misstatement or an error in the documents which may affect his merit.



INSTRUCTIONS FOR STUDENTS

COLLEGE DUES

Students are directed to deposit their dues soon after their admission in the college in confirmed according to the detail given at the last pages of the prospectus.

Note: The prescribed dues are liable to be changed according to the direction / notification of the Higher Education Department Government of the Punjab.

COLLEGE ÚNIFORM

College uniform is compulsory for the students without which they are not allowed to attend the classes. Fine amounting to Rs. 100/- will be charged on violation.

Uniform specification is added below:

FIRST SHIFT/SECOND SHIFT/BS-4 YEAR

Grey Pants, white shirt and black shoes with black socks (Green sweater / blazer in winter).

Note: However, BS-4 students must wear the white shirt with college logo on Pocket.

COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD

Students admitted to the College must obtain their Identity Cards from the Registrar Office within one week of the commencement of classes. It is compulsory for the students to display their Identity Cards during attending the college, failing which fine may be charged. In case of loss or damage of the College Identity Card, following fine has to pay to get a new card:

- 1. A new card is issued in lieu of lost card / torn off or damaged card with a fine of Rs. 100/-
- 2. Card may be issued for the third time if the second one is lost or damaged with a fine of Rs. 200/-

ATTENDANCE

If a student of intermediate class fails to attend 75% of the delivered lectures in each of his subjects, his admission will not be sent to the B.I.S.E, Lahore.

LEAVE RULES

Leave availed on medical grounds or any other grounds will not be accounted for attendance. Prior permission for the grant of leave from the competent authority must be obtained on a prescribed leave application form.

Since: 1958

In case of illness, the leave application must be signed by the father / guardian for day scholars and by the Superintendent for boarders. Such leave should not exceed 06 days. Medical certificate issued by the Medical Officer/Medical Superintendent of Govt. Hospital must be accompanied with medical leave application exceeding 06 days. Leave application must be signed by the father / guardian exceeding 02 days. Such leave is granted by the concerned teacher of the subject for which he would make such leave entry in his register. Separate leave applications are submitted by the day scholars and boarders. Leave during house examination of the college is granted only if the father / guardian of the student presents an original medical certificate prior to the commencement of the examination. Such students must appear and qualify the next supplementary examination; otherwise, they will be dropped from the College Rolls. Leave is granted by the following faculty members: -

la) Leave up to 06 days. Tutor (English or Urdu teacher)

b) Leave up to 15 days. Senior Tutor

c) Leave for more than 15 days Chief Tutor

d) Leave for BS students HOD, of the major discipline

ABSENCE/RE-ADMISSION

(A) If a student remains absent for six consecutive days or 10 days in a month or any of his enrolled class without obtaining leave from the competent authority of the College, his name will be stuck off the College Rolls.

- (B) Re-admission on these grounds will be allowed only once in an academic year (starting from September every year) with a fine of Rs. 200/- and readmission fee Rs. 50/- provided that the student applies for such re-admission within 14 days of his struck off/expulsion. This application should be duly annexed with a written guarantee / assurance from the father / guardian to the effect that the student will attend the classes regularly during the remaining period of the academic session.
- (C) After the lapse of fourteen days of expulsion an amount of Rs. 300/- as fine and Rs. 50/- as re-admission fee will be charged.
- (D) Re-admission shall be granted only within one month of the expulsion date.

RATE OF FINE

ABSENTEE FINE/UNIFORM

Fine will be imposed in the Light of the guideline provided in admission policy 2016.

SPECIAL FINE

A special fine shall be imposed by the Chief Proctor on the violation of discipline / gross misconduct. However, College Discipline Committee can impose fine exceeding Rs.1000/-. If a student causes any loss to the college property, the actual loss shall be recovered from him in addition to legal action.

PAYMENT OF FEE AND FINE

- (1) Absence from the College/leave granted by the College will not be considered an excuse for not paying dues.
- (2) If a student fails to pay his dues on the date notified by the College, he will have to pay fine in addition to the dues.
- (3) In case a student fails to pay his dues within due date, his name will be struck off the College rolls and he will be allowed re-admission according to the prescribed rules and regulations of the College.
- (4) All the first-year students (morning & evening) will be required to pay the college fees before leaving the College for part-I examination of the Board.

FEE CONCESSION AND SCHOLARSHIP

The Principal is authorized to grant half tuition fee concession to a specified number of deserving students. Such applications duly signed by the father or the guardian (if student's father has died) are submitted to the Fee Concession committee soon after the admission to the college. Fee concession is allowed on the basis of good conduct, regular class attendance and satisfactory academic record. The concession may be withdrawn on the basis of bad conduct, irregular class attendance or unsatisfactory academic record. Fee concession will not be granted at the time of the payment of dues.

Financially constrained students may apply for the financial aid by submitting an application to the Principal/Vice-Principal. Govt./
University/Local Bodies and all other scholarships



are available in the college.

Financial aid out of Provincial Zakat Fund is granted to the needy Muslim students only.

Fee concession is not granted to evening shift students. However, in case of extreme hardship, half tuition fee concession of government dues only may be granted.

COLLEGE EXAMINATIONS

It is mandatory for the students to appear in all the college examinations for their internal assessment and eligibility for the admissions to be sent to the B.I.S.E, Lahore.

RULES REGARDING COLLEGE EXAMINATION

- 1. It is compulsory for intermediate students to successfully qualify the monthly and other college tests during each academic year so that their admissions along with the internal assessed grades may be sent to BISE Lahore. Names of the students who remained absent in two consecutive monthly tests or fail in the send up test would be struck off the college rolls.
- 2. Father / Guardian of an ailing student would personally submit a medical certificate along with a leave application to the College Office prior to the commencement of the college examinations.
- 3.Board Admission can be withheld for showing poor performance in the college tests/send up examinations.
- 4. Strict disciplinary action including rustication from the college will be taken against the students for using unfair means in the college examinations.
- 5. A fine of Rs. 100/- will be charged from a student not appearing in a paper during College examinations. Besides, an absentee from class test is also liable to be fined Rs. 100/-



6. It is mandatory for the students to appear in the send up examination to be held in the month of December and Pre-Board exam in the month of March or April every year. The admission of the students who do not appear in this examination will be withdrawn.

RED CRESCENT FUND

The college administration is committed to help the students having financial problems. Last year, the talented students (85% Marks) and needy students were given financial help from the Red Crescent /Hilal-e-Ahmer Fund which was highly appreciated by the students and parents.

CURRICULAR/CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

All the possible opportunities to maintain higher standards of education are provided to the students during their stay in the college so that their mental and physical growth is ensured and could help in the development of a balanced personality.

MIGRATION

Students desirous of leaving the College should apply to the principal with signatures of their father / guardian. Migration to this College from other cities is usually not undertaken because of limited seats. However, under unavoidable circumstances, (like job transfer and shifting of residence) genuine migration cases may be considered in the light of merit policy of the government. Migration from a local college is not permitted.

PROCTORIAL BOARD

Proctorial Board is responsible for maintaining discipline and conducive academic atmosphere in the college. The Board comprises Chief Proctor, Deputy Proctors and staff members. The Chief Proctor is responsible for the direction, control and monitoring of the overall activities of the Proctorial Board, however, every staff member is a proctor and therefore is authorized to check any student in the college premises. Every student is supposed to maintain discipline and academic atmosphere in the College Campus. Cases of violations of College discipline are reported to the Chief Proctor, who immediately takes appropriate disciplinary action on violation of College rules & regulations. The members of the Board are empowered to fine the defaulter students at the following rates:

Chief Proctor Rs. 500/- **Add. Chief Proctor** Rs. 200/- **Dy. Chief Proctor** Rs. 100/- **Proctors** Rs. 50/-

Fines imposed by the Chief Proctor or the Proctorial Board shall not be remitted or reduced.

A Proctor will ensure that students:

- 1. Display College Identity Card.
- 2. Do not wear T-Shirts, Jeans and Joggers.

- 3. Must dress up in the College Uniform.
- 4. Should not disturb the academic atmosphere.
- 5. Do not use camera, mobile phone or any other such devices in the College.

COLLEGE DISCIPLINE

All the students are bound to abide by the following rules and regulations:

- 1. Follow Ethics and pillars of religion.
- 2. Show respect to the teachers.
- 3. Wear uniform and display College Identity Card.
- 4. Maintain discipline in the college Campus, hostel, libraries, canteen and ground.
- 5. Park all types of vehicles at the specified parking area of the college.
- 6. Do Not damage the plants.

Following acts are strictly prohibited and in case of violation, Proctors are empowered to take disciplinary action on the spot:

- 1. Disturbing the academic atmosphere of the College
- 2. Damaging the college property.
- 3. Visiting or inviting outsiders on the college campus without prior permission of the administration.
- 4. Bill sticking in the College Campus.
 - 5. Discussion about Political Parties or provocative discussions/ speeches/debates.









- 6. Noisy attitude in the library, laboratories and around the class rooms.
- 7. Use/possession of narcotics or smoking.
- 8. Involving in quarrelsome or unethical activities.
- 9. Tearing the notices from the notice boards and damaging the newspapers placed on the stands.
- 10. To display/paste any kind of poster, sticker, play card etc. on places other than academic ones.

Note: The Principal/Proctorial can ban entry of a student in the College/Hostel premises for a specific period or forever on account of misconduct/indiscipline.

SECURITY ARRANGEMENTS

A comprehensive security system has been established in the college to provide safe environment for the academic, cocurricular and sports activities. Students are expected to extend their full co-operation to the college administration and security staff in execution of their duties and help to maintain order and discipline on college campus. They must display their college ID Card while entering the college and wear it during college hours.

COLLEGE SPORTS BOARD

College Sports Board manages and promotes all types of college sports. The students are awarded prizes and college colour on their outstanding performance in different competitions and the annual games. Students can seek advice from Chairman/Secretary Sports Board on matters relating to sports activities.





LIBRARIES

There are two libraries in the College:

- A) Hans Raj Main library.
- B) Dr. Hameed Ahmad Khan Postgraduate library.


All the books covering every area of study are available in the College Libraries and they offer a real treasure of literature and academic publications to the faculty and the students. Both the libraries contain more than 50,000 books with a wide range of periodicals to provide valuable material necessary for research, reference and acquiring knowledge. New and latest books are added to cater for the needs of the readers. All the important National Dailies are available during library timings. The students are advised to make use of this treasure. The main library is to be utilized by all the college students whereas the postgraduate library is exclusively meant for postgraduate students.

Dr. Sadiq Ali Gill Collection:

On the request of Dr. Akhtar Hussain Sandhu, Dr. Sadiq Ali Gill, Department of History, Punjab University, Lahore has gifted 1,000 of academic books and thesis to the college.

Dr. Hameed Ahmad Khan Collection:

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RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LIBRARY.

For the convenience of the students and the faculty, following are the usual timings to benefit from the libraries:

Summer 08:00 AM to 06:00 PM. Winter 08:00 AM to 05:00 PM.

The College faculty and students can borrow books (faculty members can borrow up to 05 books for a month whereas the non-teaching staff would borrow only a single book for 15 days). The students cannot borrow more than three books at a time.

The detail library rules are displayed on the notice board of Library.

COLLEGE LEAVING RULES:

- 1. Students who need to leave the College should submit application bearing the signatures of father/ guardian.
- 2. No student is allowed to leave the College unless he has paid all sort of dues like hostel charges, fee, fine, library books, sports goods etc.

TUTORIAL SYSTEM

- 1. The tutorial system operates under the supervision of a Chief Tutor.
- 2. A Senior Tutor (Science) for the science students and a Senior Tutor (Arts) for the Arts/ General Science and Commerce students are designated for this purpose.



- 3. Tutors are appointed for (Science/Commerce and Arts) Degree level students who are authorized to sanction leave up to 6 days only.
- 4. Medical Leave for 06 to 15 days dully supported by a medical certificate is to be submitted to the concerned senior tutor.
- 5. Leave for more than 15 days is sanctioned by the Chief Tutor only.
- 6. Students are required to submit all of their documents like leave, fee concession or remission of fee etc. through their concerned tutor to the Principal / authorized officer.




CRESCENT HOSTEL

Crescent Hostel, committed to provide quality amenities and secure atmosphere, is 'home away from home' for students who are offered numerous facilities to make their stay academically fruitful and comfortable. Limited boarding facility is available for students residing outside the city of Lahore. The students whose parents / guardians are residing or serving in Lahore are not entitled to get admission in the Hostel. Only bona-fide regular full-time students of Government Islamia Graduate College Civil Lines, Lahore are eligible. The College does not guarantee the hostel boarding facility to all the students admitted to this college. Allocation of seats among various academic groups (Science, Arts, Commerce, BS-4 Year M.A/M.Sc. etc) is made on the proportional demand basis for each group. Admitted college students desirous of seeking admission in the hostel should obtain such prospectus from the Crescent Hostel.

The hostel remains a part of the College bound by certain rules and regulations which will facilitate a memorable stay for the boarders. The internal administration and discipline of the hostel is vested in the warden is assisted by the members of the Hostel Management Committee. The policies of the hostel are decided by the HMC under the overall guidelines and policies of the College.



I) ADMISSION PROCEDURE

- Admission is made strictly on academic merit.
- Applications for admission to hostel should be made in the prescribed form which can be obtained from the Hostel Office.
- Before signing the admission form, you must go through the Prospectus carefully to avoid any misinterpretation or misunderstanding later. The compliance with the defined rules is mandatory and the responsibility of having read the rules lies with the students and parents/guardians.
- The complete applications with all required documents should be submitted in the Hostel Office on or before the last date.



(ii) ELIGIBILITY/ADMISSION CRITERIA

Admission to the Hostel cannot be claimed as a matter of right.

Only morning shift students of the College whose parents are not residing in Lahore will be considered for Hostel accommodation.

- Before admission to the Hostel, every applicant shall have to produce documentary evidence that he has already been admitted to the college.
- The merit of Intermediate (First Year students) the following procedure may be adopted to decide the ranking of the candidate: -
- a) Marks in last exam
- b) Distance (The farthest distance will be preferred)

However, the Hostel Management Committee is authorized to verify the credentials and may seek additional information in this regard during interaction with parents/local guardian at the time of admission.

Extension in Admission for BS students to the hostel shall be considered on the basis of performance in the immediate previous examination and attendance of classes (Lecture + Tutorial + Practical) shall be raised to 75% or more of the total classes held during the Previous Academic Year.


- 1. Hostel Committee may revise Hostel Admission Dues and Monthly Fixed Dues due to increase in commodities prices and Utility Bills etc.







